Sub: Health and Family Welfare Department- Colour schemes (internal & external) and Specifications for signages for Health care institutions in the State -instructions issued

Government of Kerala is developing various Health care institutions in the state using State Plan funds, funds from the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB), Loans from National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD), assistance from Government of India, Development funds of Representatives of people and with the assistance of Local Self Government institutions. Government felt it necessary to specify the Colour schemes both internal and external and fix specifications for signage's in all Health Care Institutions under the Control of Health Department. Government after detailed discussions fianlised the following colour schemes and signages for various Hospitals in the state.

Hospital Signage

Guidelines and Types of signage that have to be installed

- 1. External Way finding
- 2. Internal Way finding
- 3. Services listing signage
- 4. Doctor Directory
- Availability & non availability of doctors with days/timings
- 6. Patient safety
- 7. Fire Safety
- 8. Services for physically challenged
- 9. Locating Lifts & Staircases
- 10. Locating Public Utility Places
- 11. Patient's Rights & Responsibilities
- 12. Service Areas
- 13. No Entry Zones
- 14. Others

Font style for signage

- Preferred lettering style is 'Helvetica Medium' upper and lower case generally.
- Upper case only is recommended for the building Main Entry Sign.
- Internationally recognised symbols (pictograms) in place of room titles are acceptable.
- Sizes of letters in relation to reading distances, mounting heights etc. shall comply with the relevant standards (IS 9457:2002).
- Braille and Tactile signage are recommended for all signs within reach range.
- There should be a luminance contrast of 30% minimum between the lettering and the background of all signs.

Height of Signages (from finished floor level)

- Door Signs 1.60 m
- · Wall mounted room signs 2.10 m
- Signs for Physically Handicap 0.80

Categories of External Signage

A. Directional Signs

 External directional signs shall have white reflective letters on a blue background (Refer Appendix 1). The signs shall preferably be of steel or aluminium construction.

B. Illuminated Signs

External illuminated signs for an Emergency Unit shall have white letters on a red background (Refer Appendix 1).

- External illuminated signs for the Main Entry and Night Entry shall have white letters on a blue background (Refer Appendix 1).
- The sign for Emergency department/Emergency unit should read as "Emergency".

C. Street Signs

- Street signs shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Municipality and/or the appropriate section of the state roads and traffic authority.
- Accreditation Standards usually require that the facility have street directional signs sufficient to enable it to be easily located from the major access road in the area.
- The Emergency Unit, if provided, will require an illuminated sign that is clearly visible from the entrance to the Hospital site.

Categories of Internal Signage

A. Directional Signage

Non illuminated directional and area identification signs should be as follows:

- Ceiling or wall mounted.
- Text on contrasting background dark lettering on light background preferred.
- A guide for the patient or visitor until they reach a room or door sign for the intended destination.
- Not obscure other critical ceiling fixtures such as emergency lighting or fire exit signs.
- Serious consideration should be given to the provision of alternate low level signs in Braille (as well as plain text) in

Hospital Entrance Foyers leading to major departments, lifts and public amenities.

 It is recommended that such Braille signs be installed immediately above the handrail.

B. Door Numbers

- Door/Frame Numbering or tags may be required by the management for easy maintenance.
- This is a separate concept to room signage showing the function of the room.
- Door numbering may be done in consultation with hospital authorities.
- Unlike room signs, door numbering may be small and unobtrusive.

C. Bed Numbers

_Bed numbers shall be shown outside the general/pay wards.

- These shall be one number per bed.
- This is to assist in finding patients.
- In bedrooms with more than one bed, all bed numbers or the range of numbers should be shown on the sign outside the room.
- · For example:
 - o Beds 78 & 79 or
 - o Beds 78 to 81
- In bedrooms with more than one bed, each bed number shall be displayed at the bed head also.
- Bed numbers outside the room must be clearly visible from the corridor and not be obscured by other objects or wall returns.

D. Room Signs

Non-illuminated, internal and external room-function identification signs that are located on doors require the following considerations:

- The format used should allow easy replacement of the sign or sign inset
- · when the room function changes.
- It may be appropriate to deliberately omit signs on certain doors used only by staff.
- Special notes may be installed to identify restricted access to certain rooms or departments.

E. Miscellaneous Signs

The healthcare precinct will include various other signs that may be illuminated or non-illuminated such as:

- Illuminated 'X-ray Room in Use' or 'Laser in Use' signs
- Radiation warning signs and symbols
- Security surveillance warnings
- Safety warning signs.

 The colours and wording used should meet the requirements of the relevant code or regulating authority.

F. Fire Services & Egress Signs

- Fire services and egress/ exit signs will be installed in accordance with the local fire services codes and standards.
- As fire service equipment signs are required to be identified from any direction, consideration should be given to use of cantilevered wall signs in these locations.

G. General instructions

- The colour details are shown in the following format Colour name (HTML Name) - Hex (RGB) / Decimal (RGB).
- All these colours can be generated through computer graphics for background boards and letters
