



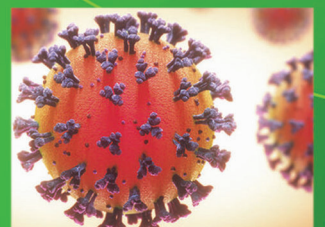

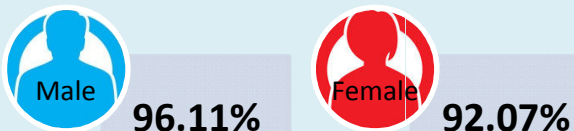

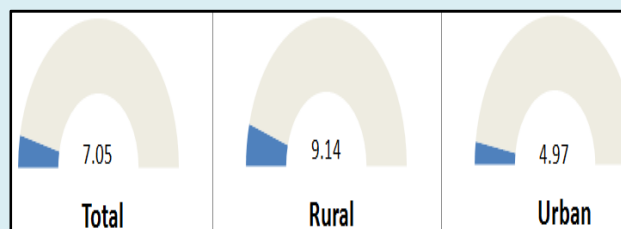

4. PERCENTAGE OF POPULATION BELOW POVERTY LINE 2011-12 (RBI)

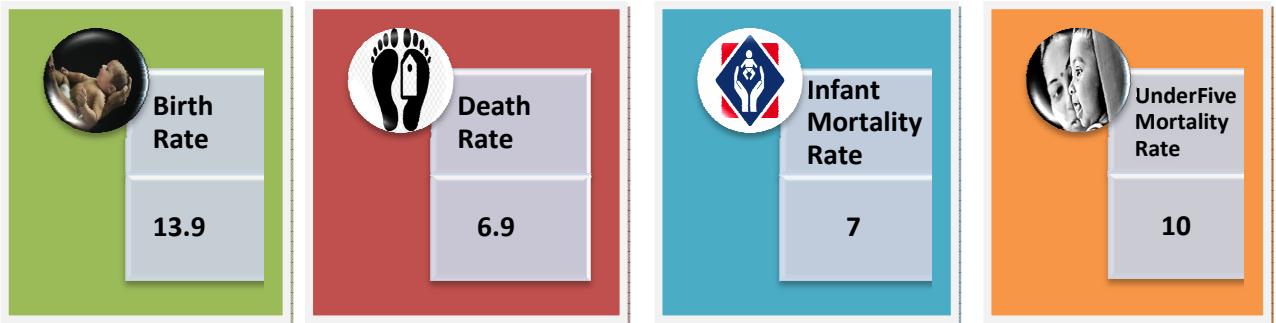

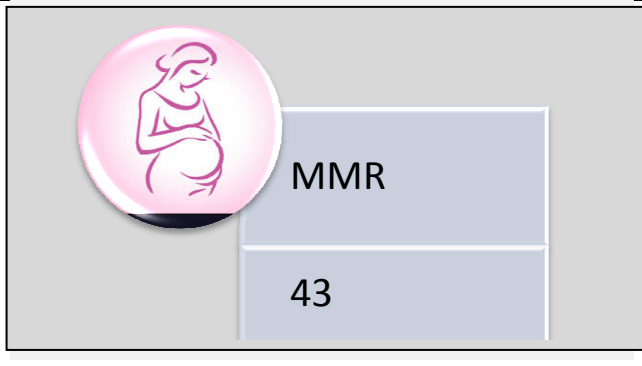

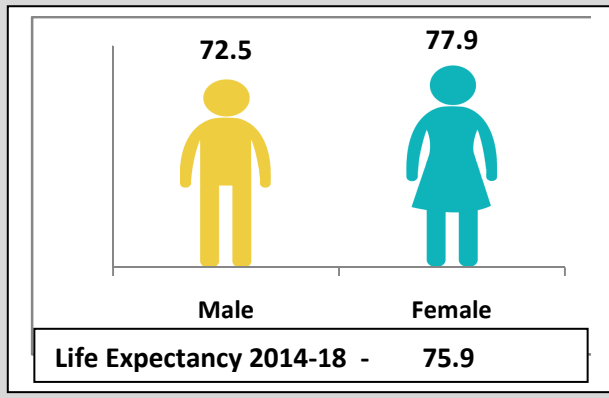
6. BIRTH RATE AND MORTALITY RATES (SRS 2018)



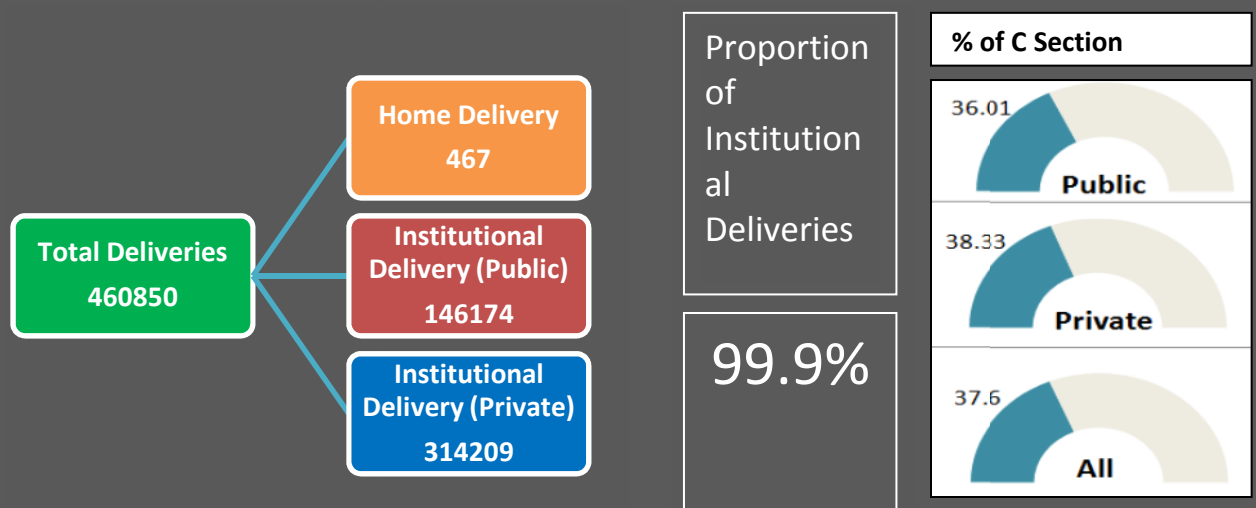
6.1 MATERNAL MORTALITY RATIO (MMR) SRS 2016-18



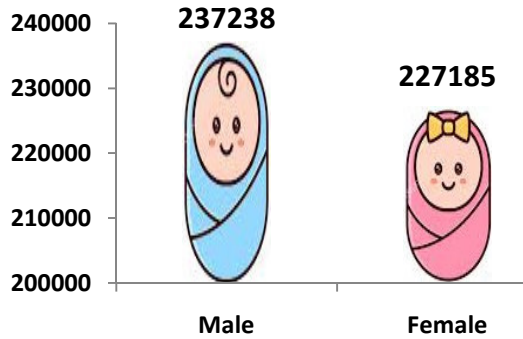

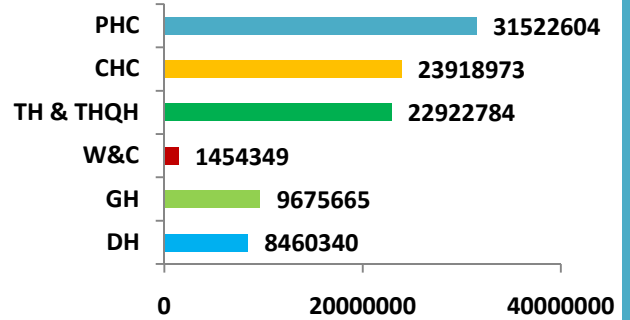


9. LIVE BIRTH 2019-20 (SOURCE : HMIS)



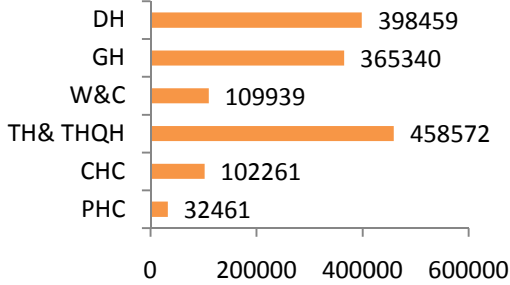

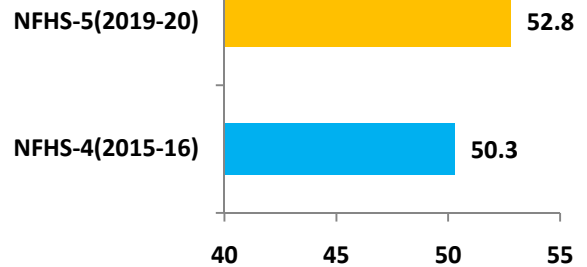
11. IPD BY TYPE OF FACILITY 2019-20 (HMIS)



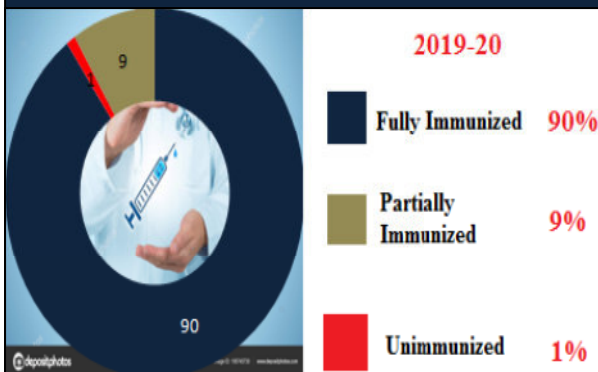

13. FULL IMMUNIZATION COVERAGE 0-1 YEARS (RCH PORTAL)



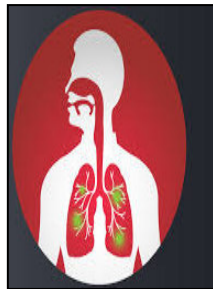
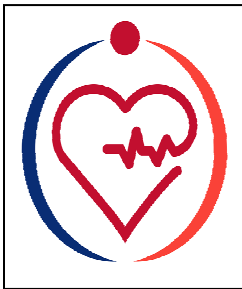

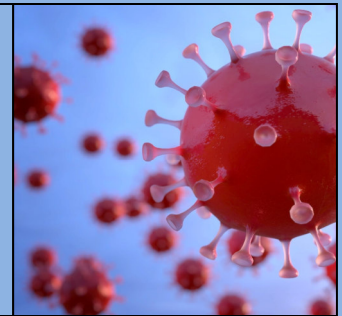

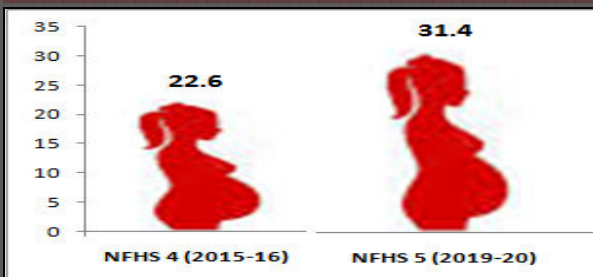

17. PERCENTAGE OF CHILDREN AGED 1-4 YEARS HAVING ANAEMIA (ANY <11.0 G/DL)



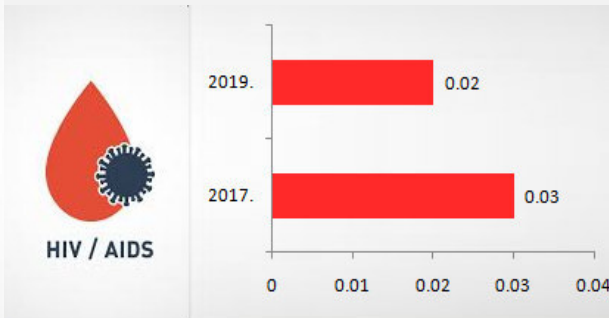
18. PERCENTAGE OF CHILDREN AGED 1-4 YEARS HAVING ANAEMIA (ANY <11.0 G/DL)

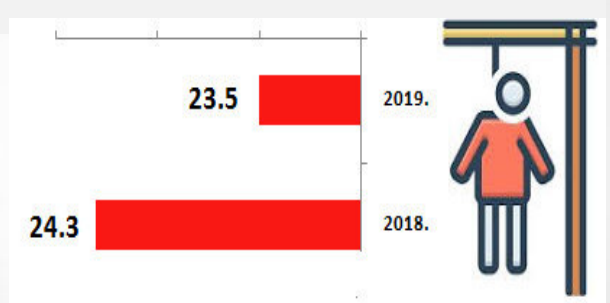

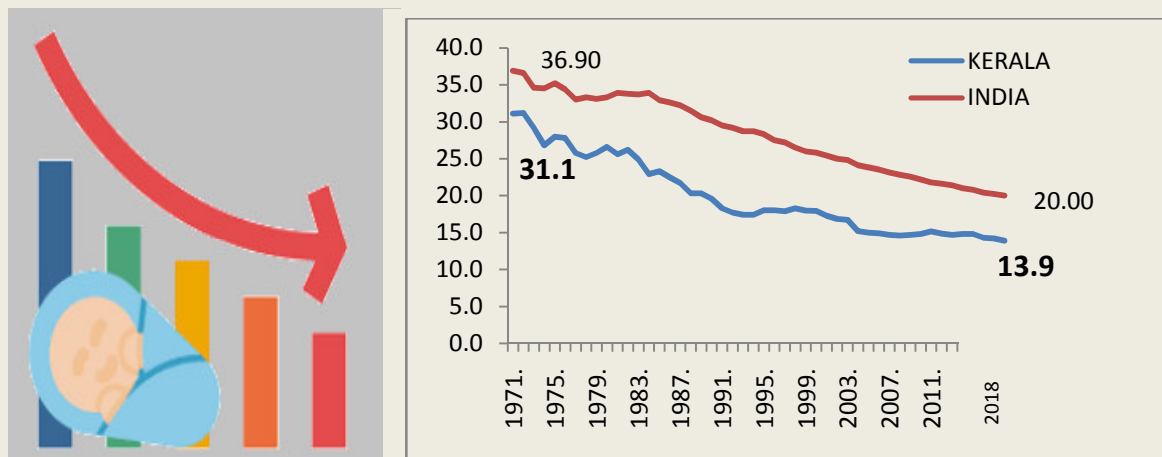

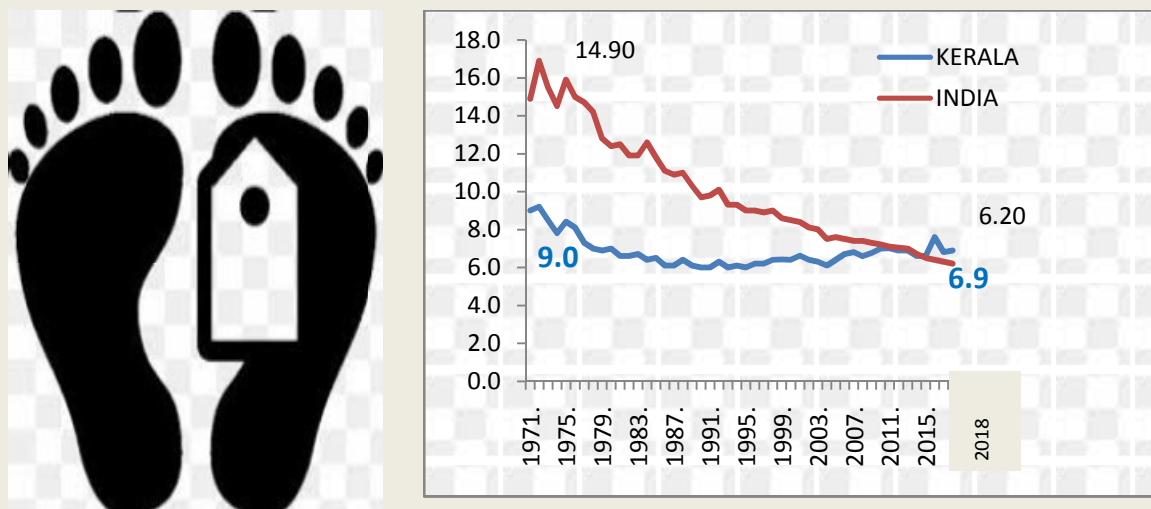

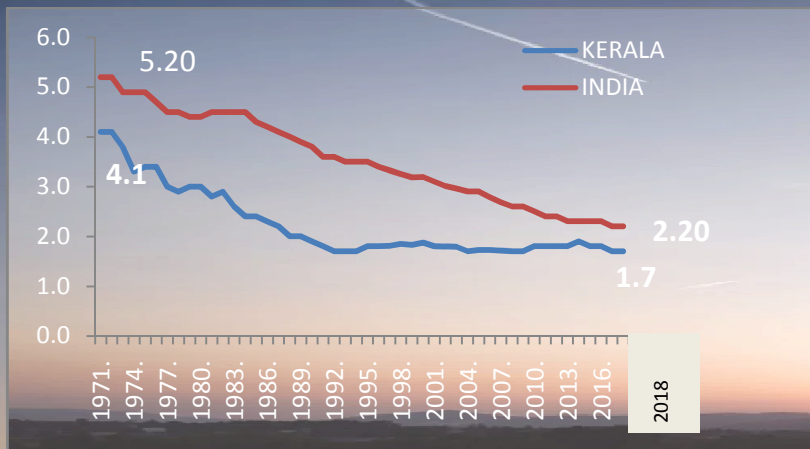

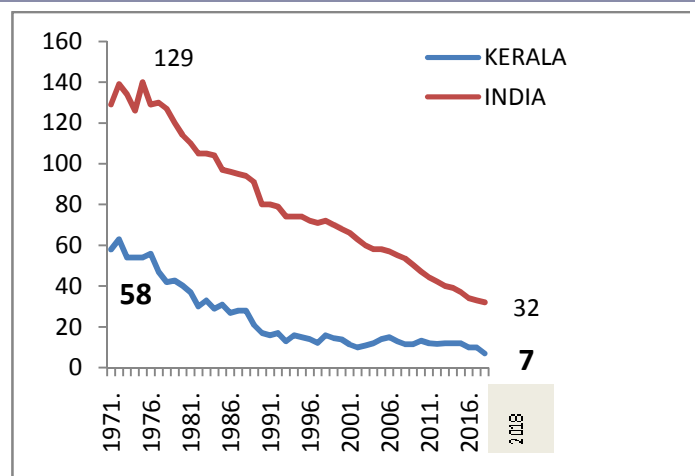

2.1.1.3 TOTAL FERTILITY RATE



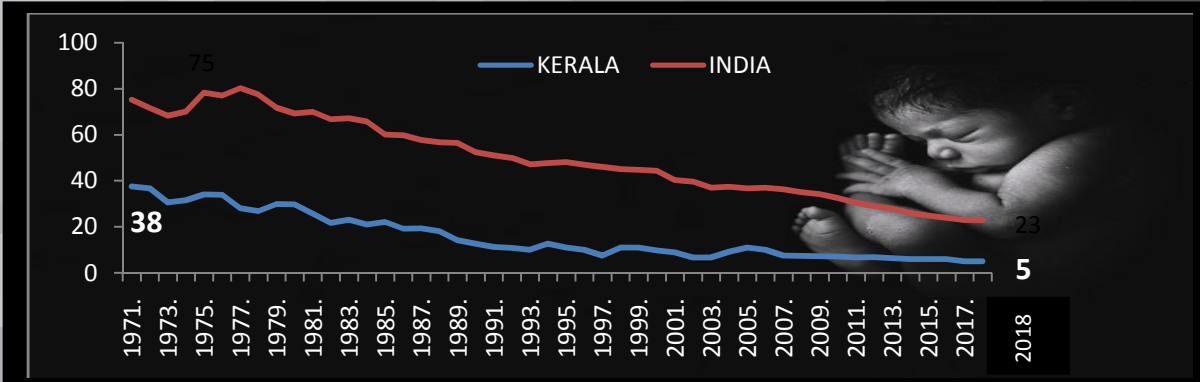

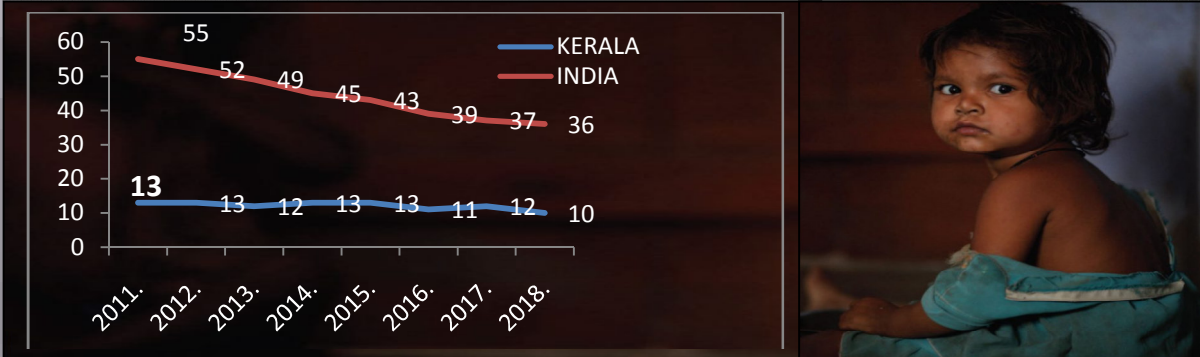

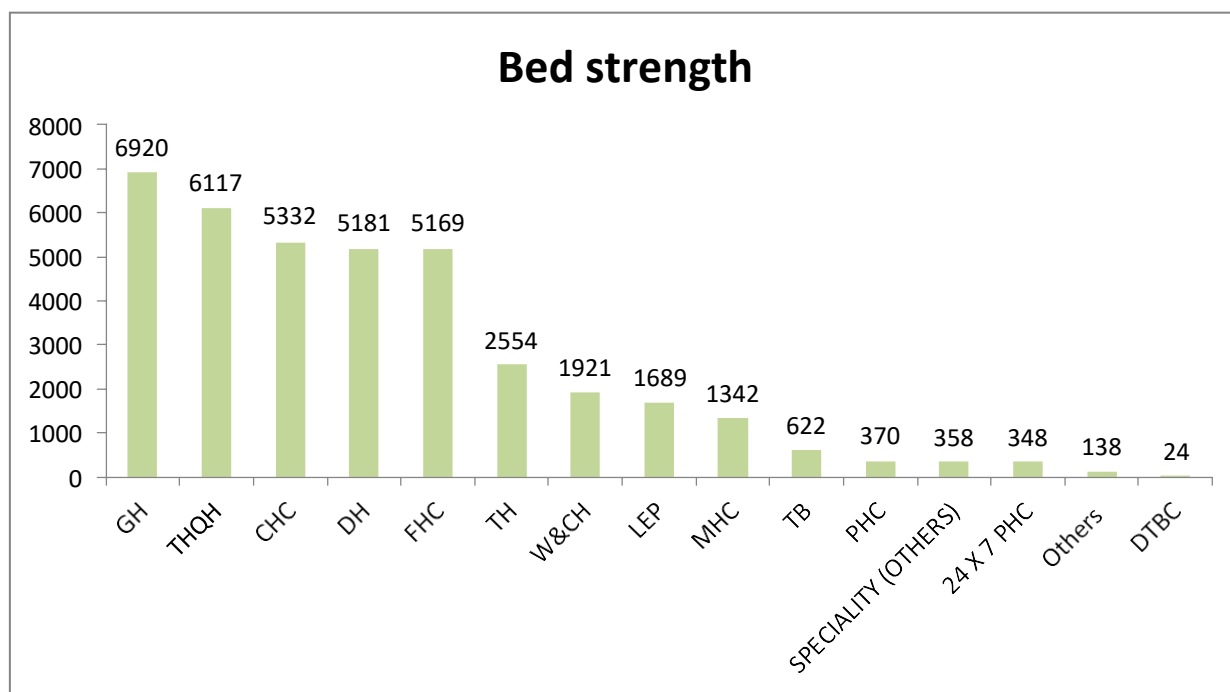

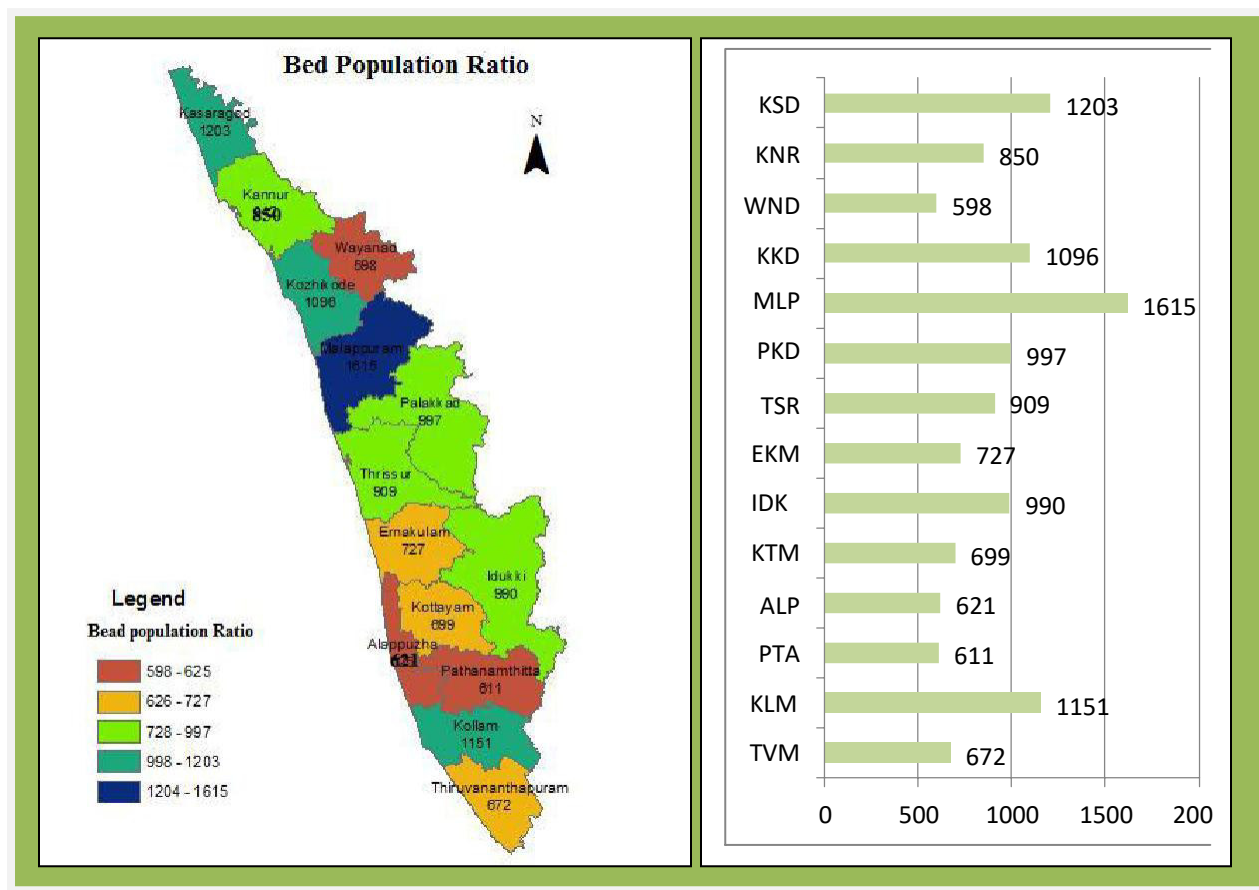

Chart 3.3.1 Percentage of increase in OP and IP in the institutions under DHS and NHM from 2018-19 to 2019-20

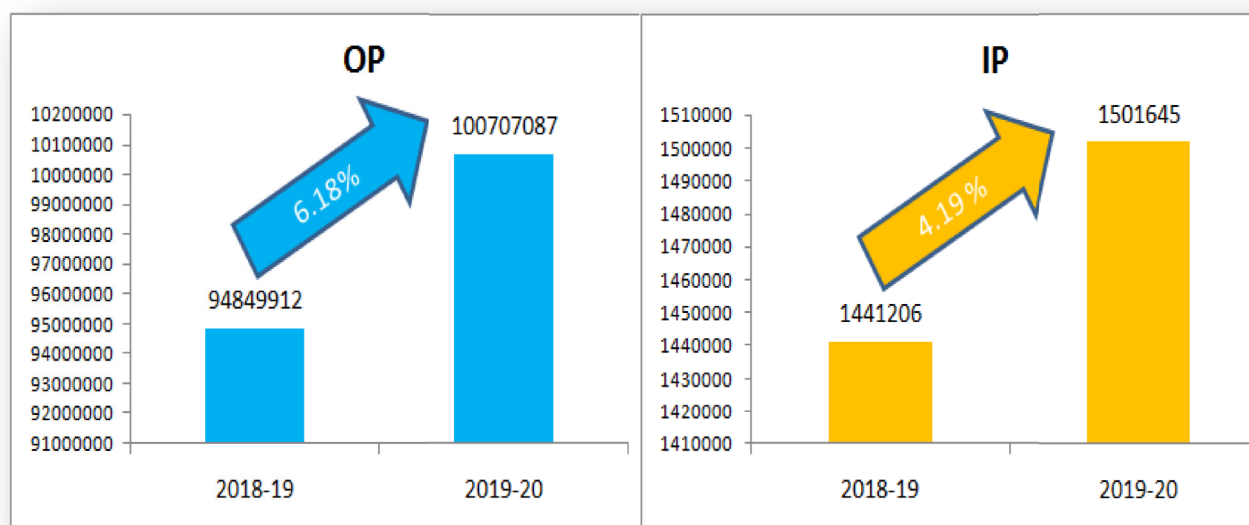
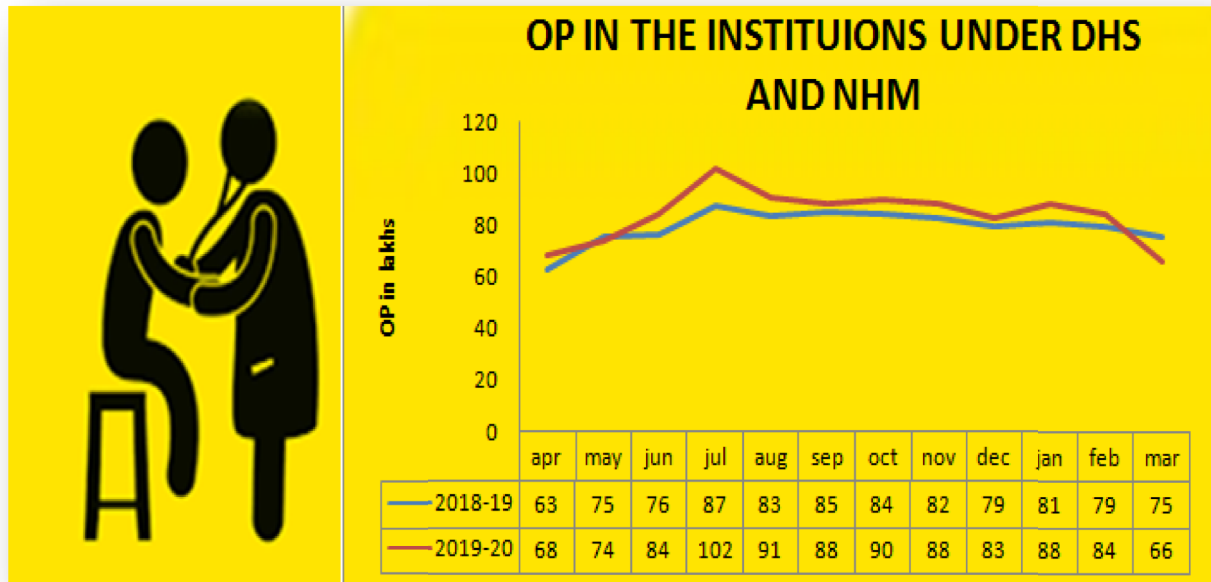
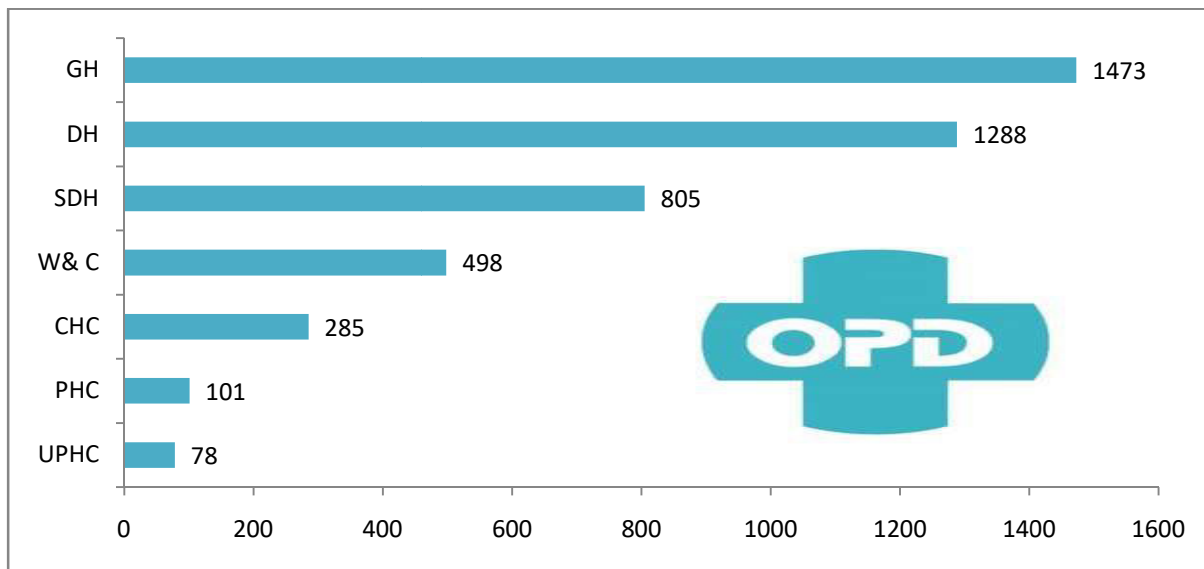


Chart 3.3.2 Month wise comparison of OP in the institutions under DHS and NHM

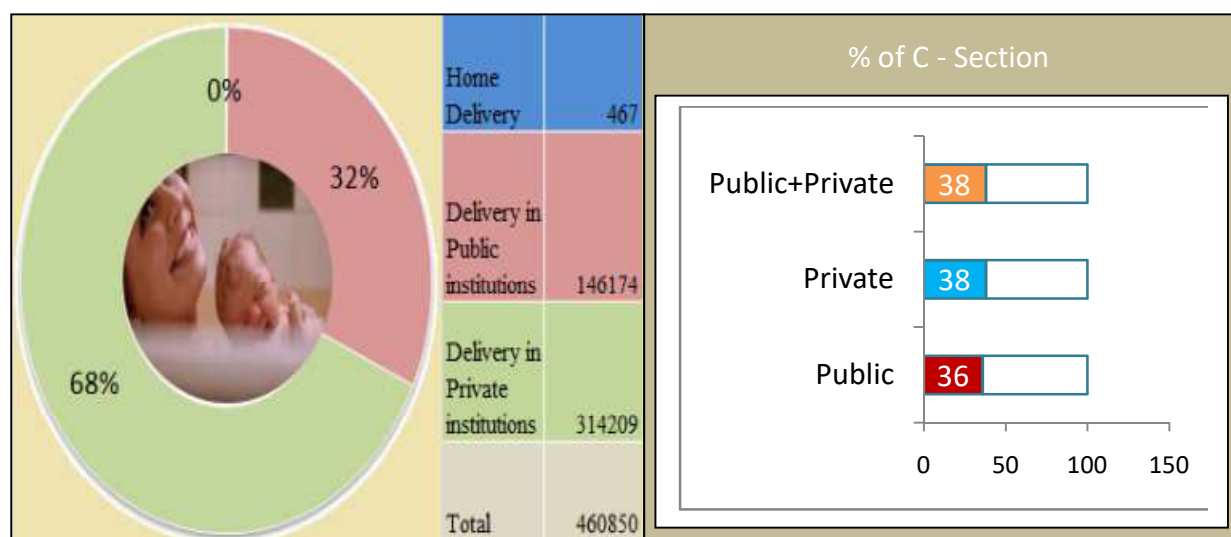

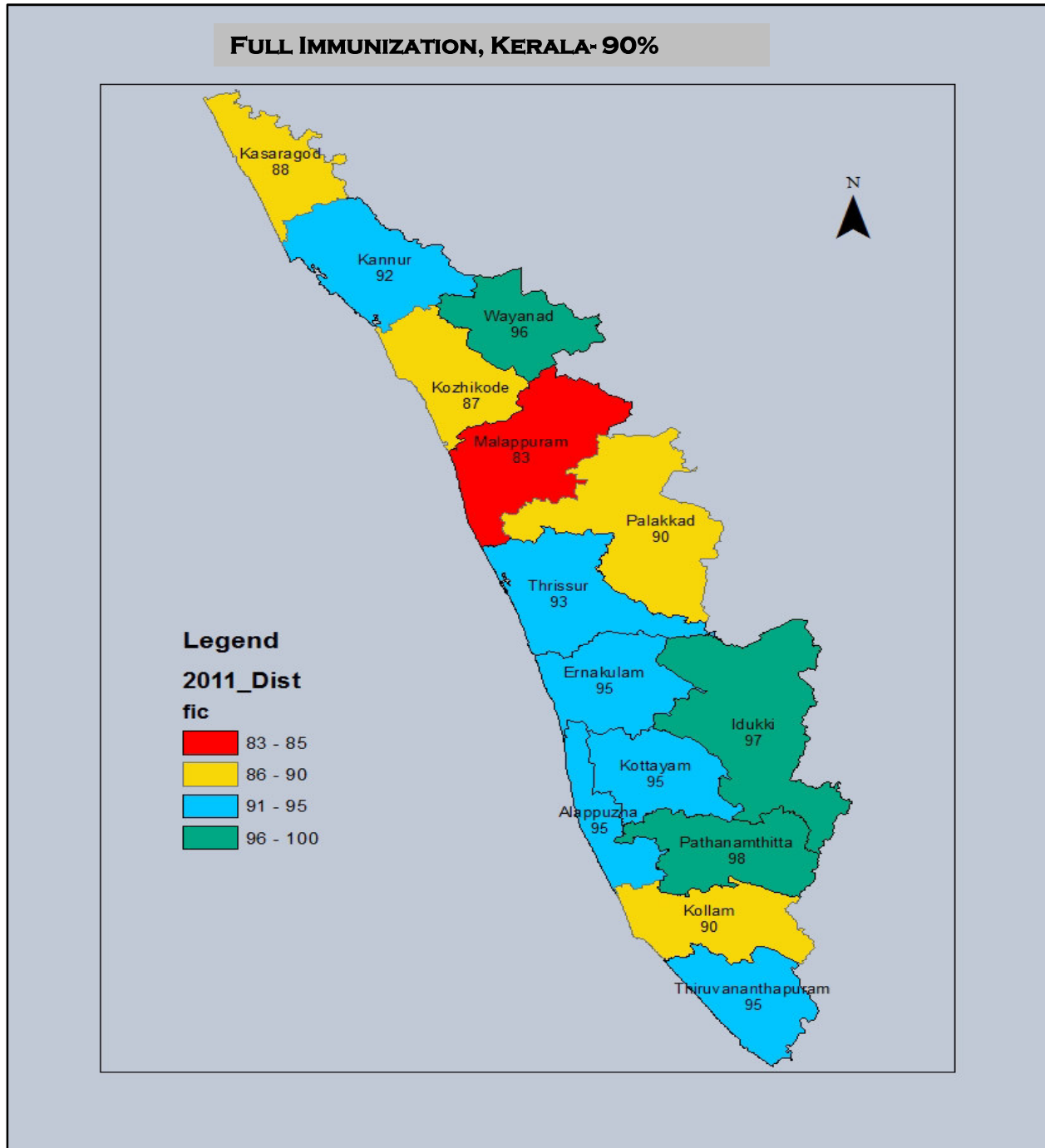

chart 3.4.4.1 1 Immunization coverage in Kerala 2019-20(Children born in 2018-19)

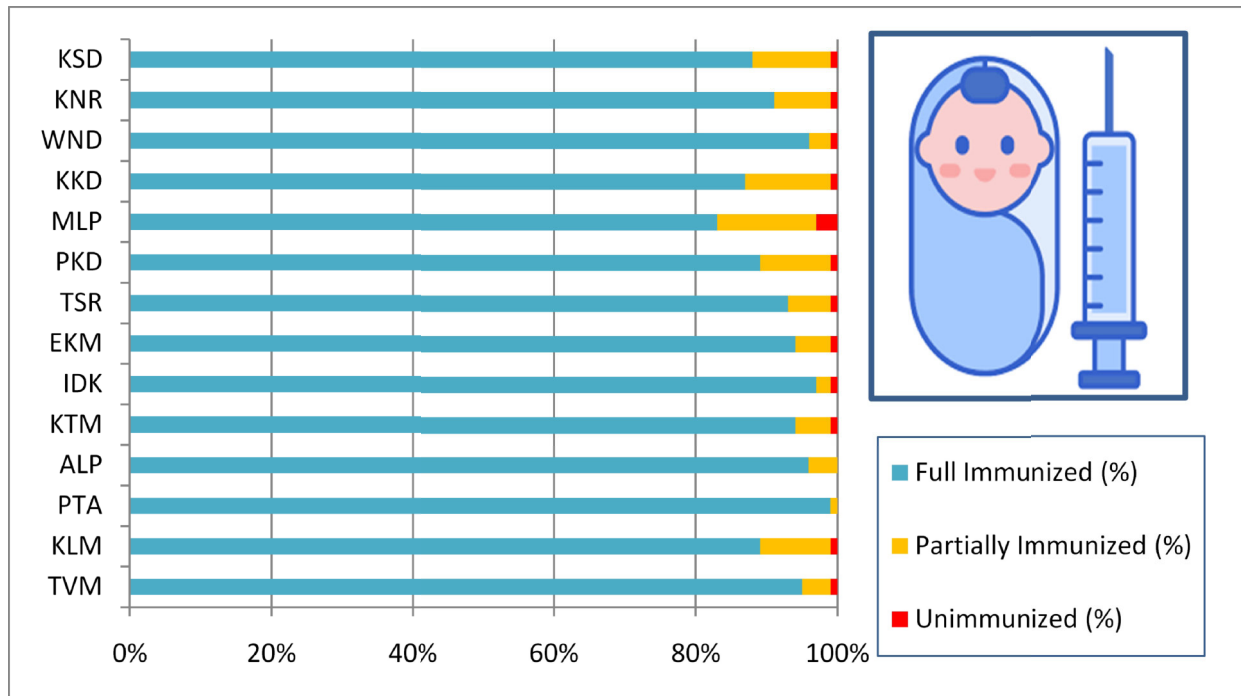


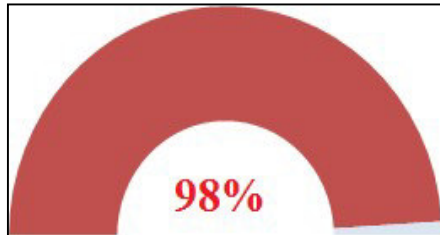

Chart 3.4.4.1.1 Intensified Pulse Polio Immunization Program 2020-District wise Achievement (%)

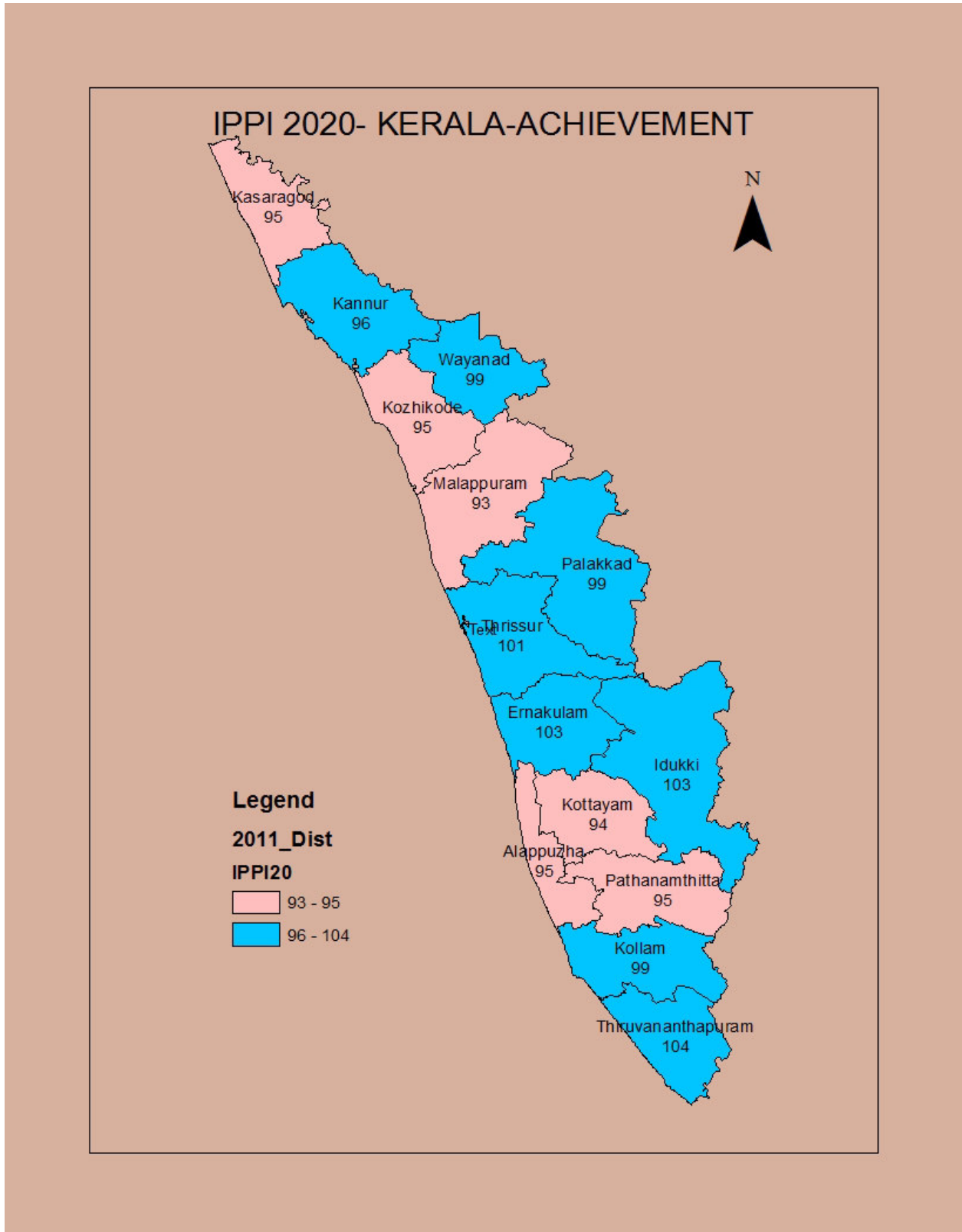

About the Programme

The Government of India is committed to improve immunization coverage and achieve full immunization coverage of 90 percent. Launch of massive routine immunization campaigns, such as Mission Indradhanush (MI) and Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI), in part, reflects government's efforts under Universal Immunization Program to reduce child mortality and morbidity. To boost the RI coverage in the country, Government is now planning to introduce Intensified Mission Indradhanush 2.0 to ensure reaching the unreached with all available vaccines and accelerate the coverage of children and pregnant women in the identified districts and blocks from December 2019-March 2020. An IMI 2.0 Portal has been designed to manage the data reporting and analysis, and to update the activities of the ministries/departments and will capture pre-campaign activities, during activity achievements, and post campaign indicators with indicators on immunization coverage and of the line ministries. Chart 4.5.1 District wise Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) 2019-20

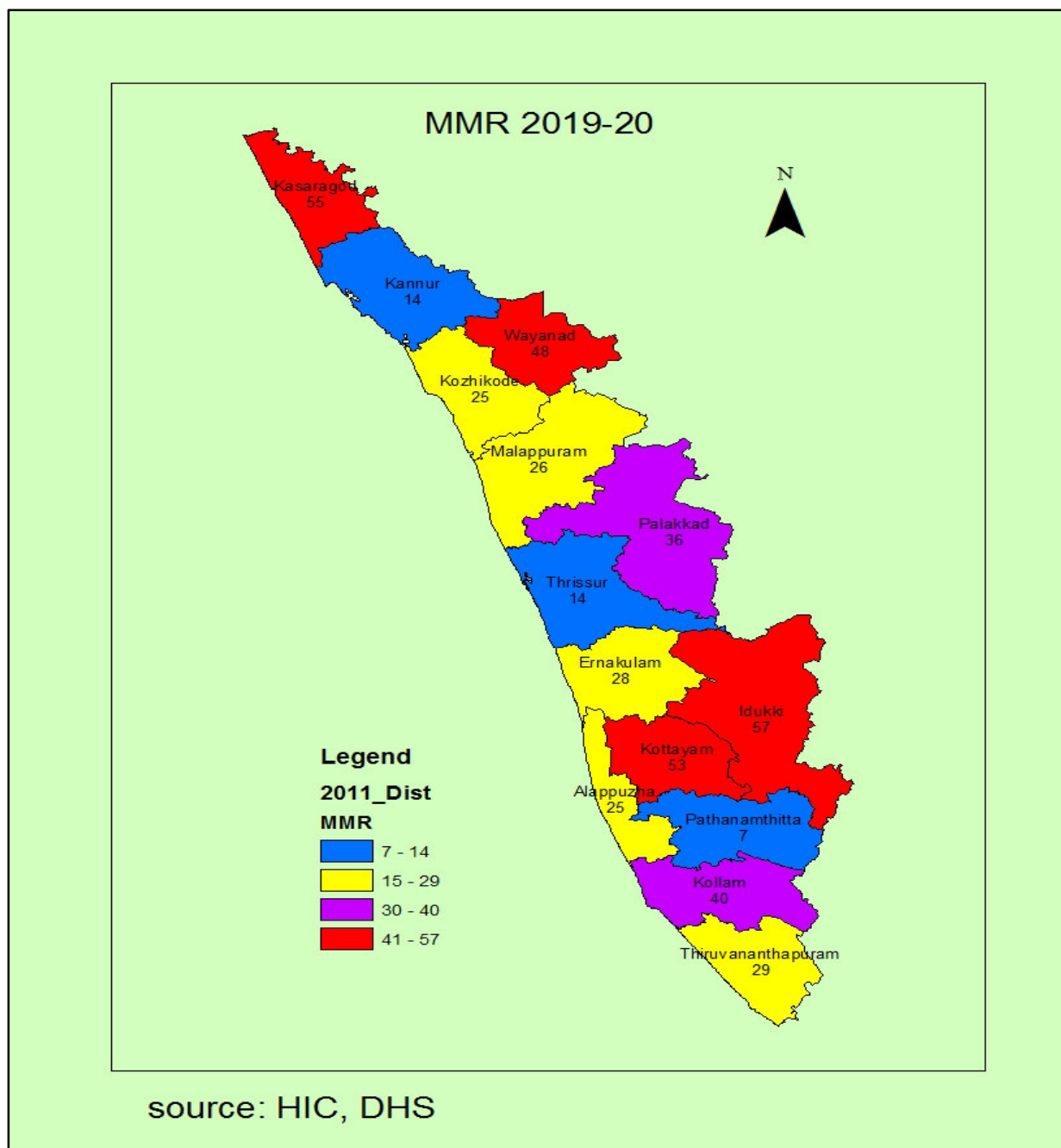

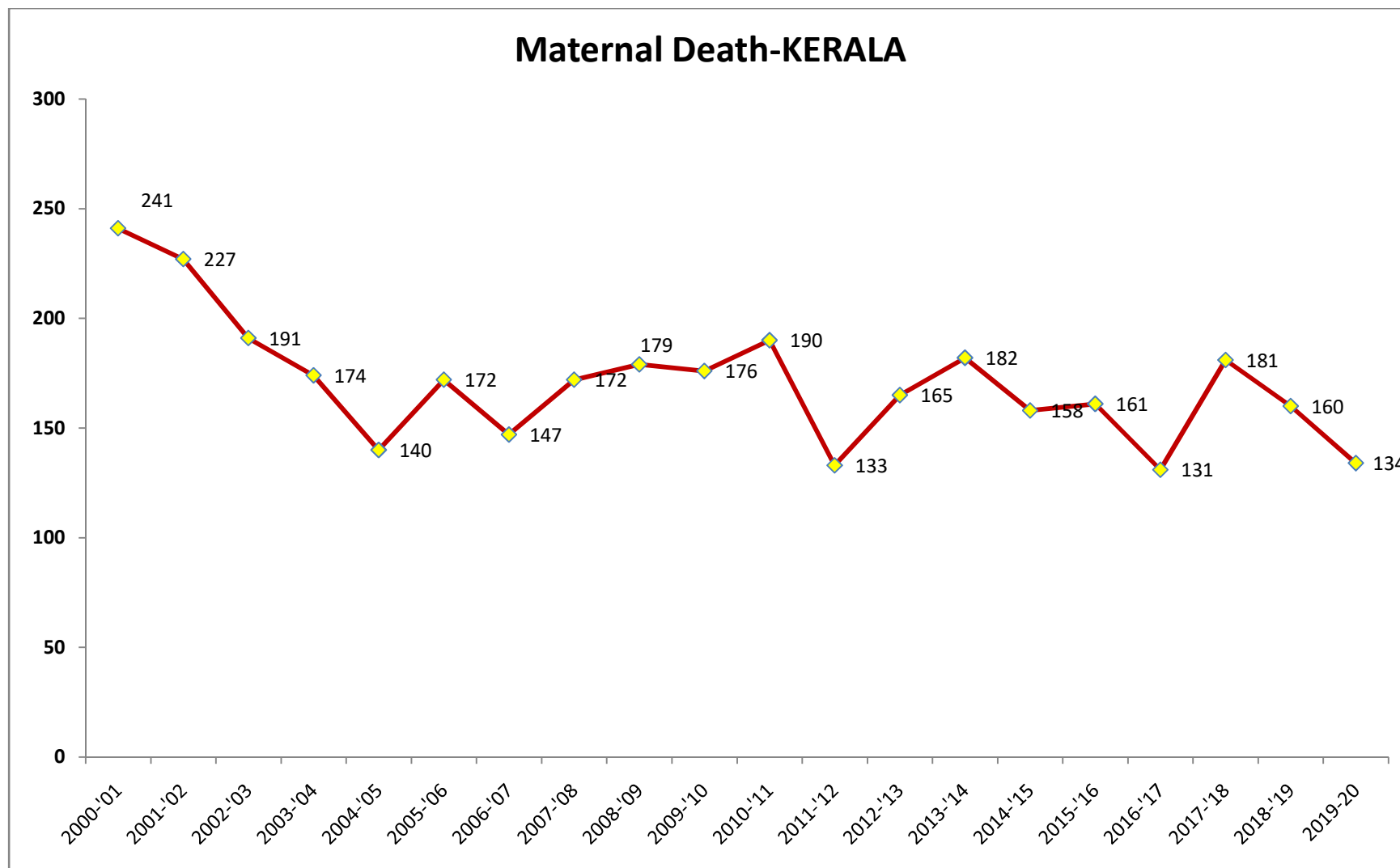

Chart 4.5.2.1 Neo-Natal Mortality Rate (NMR) 2019-20

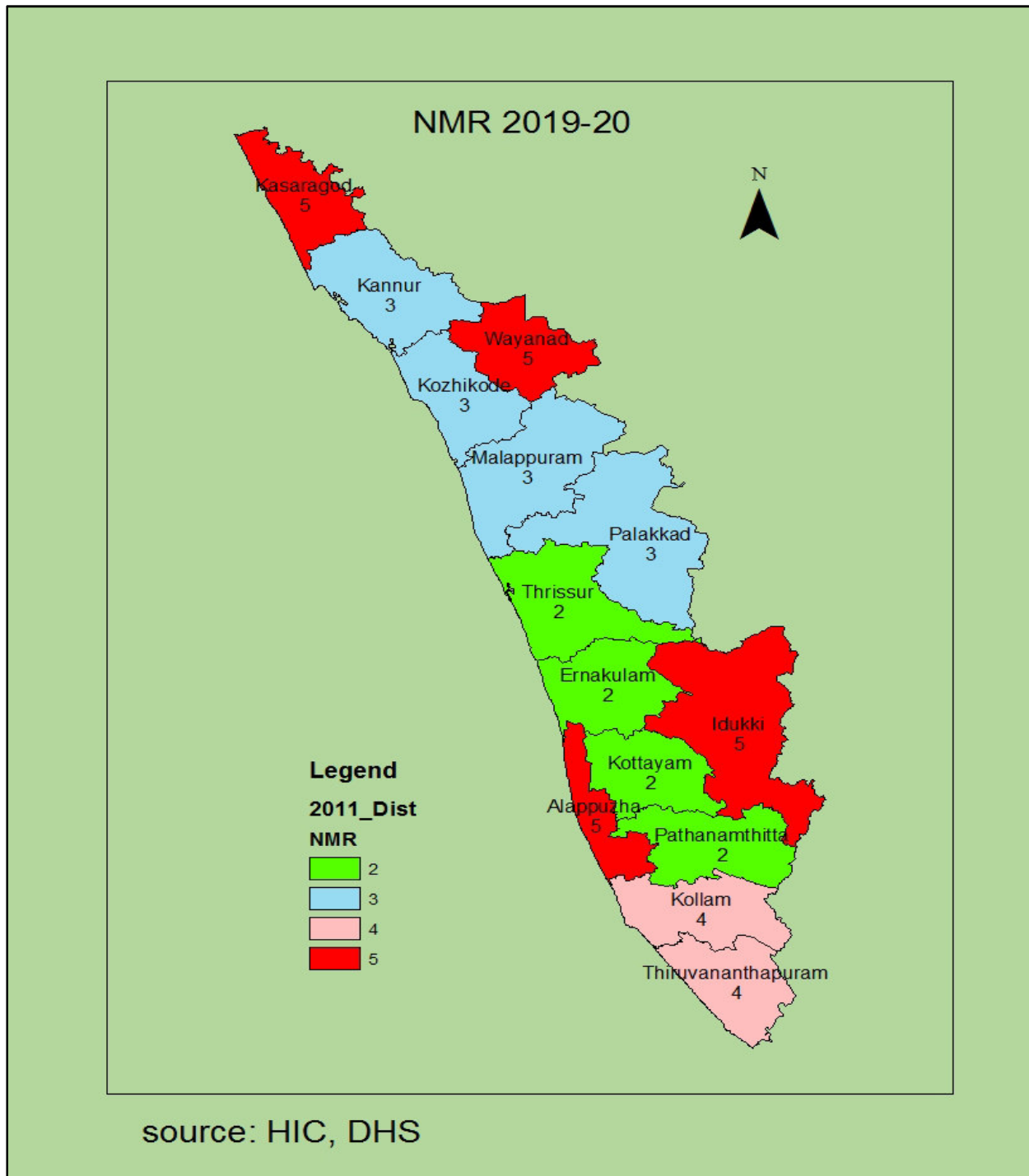

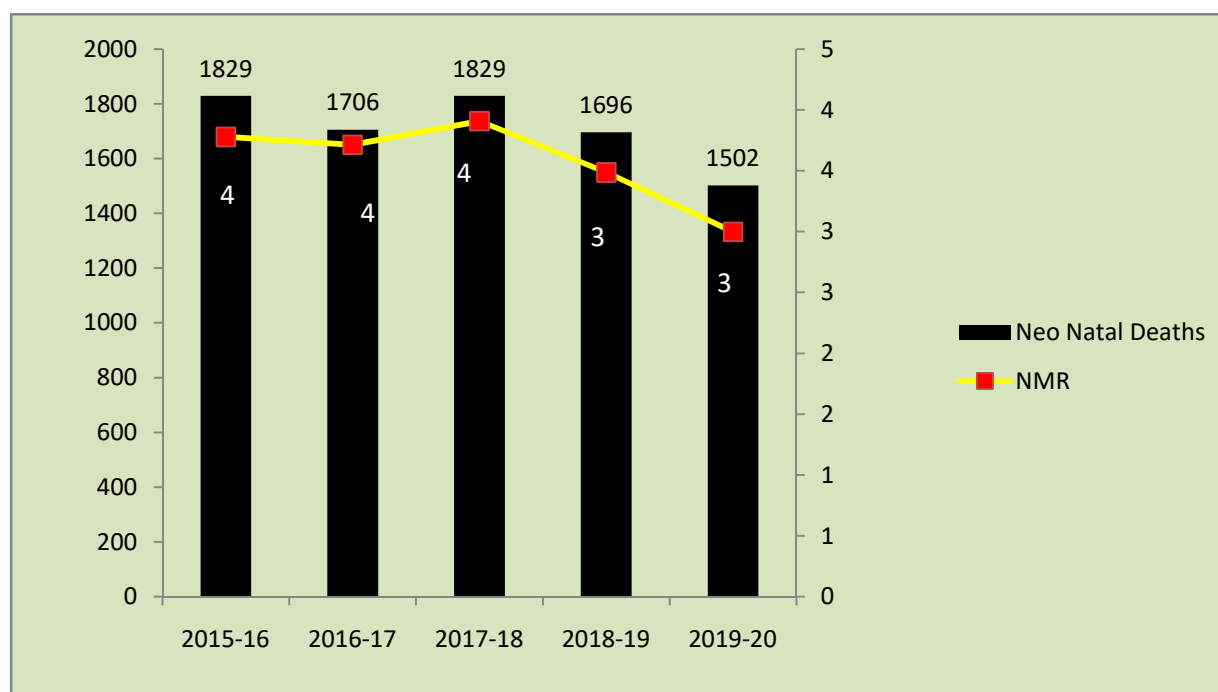

Chart 3.5.3.1 District Wise Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) 2019-20

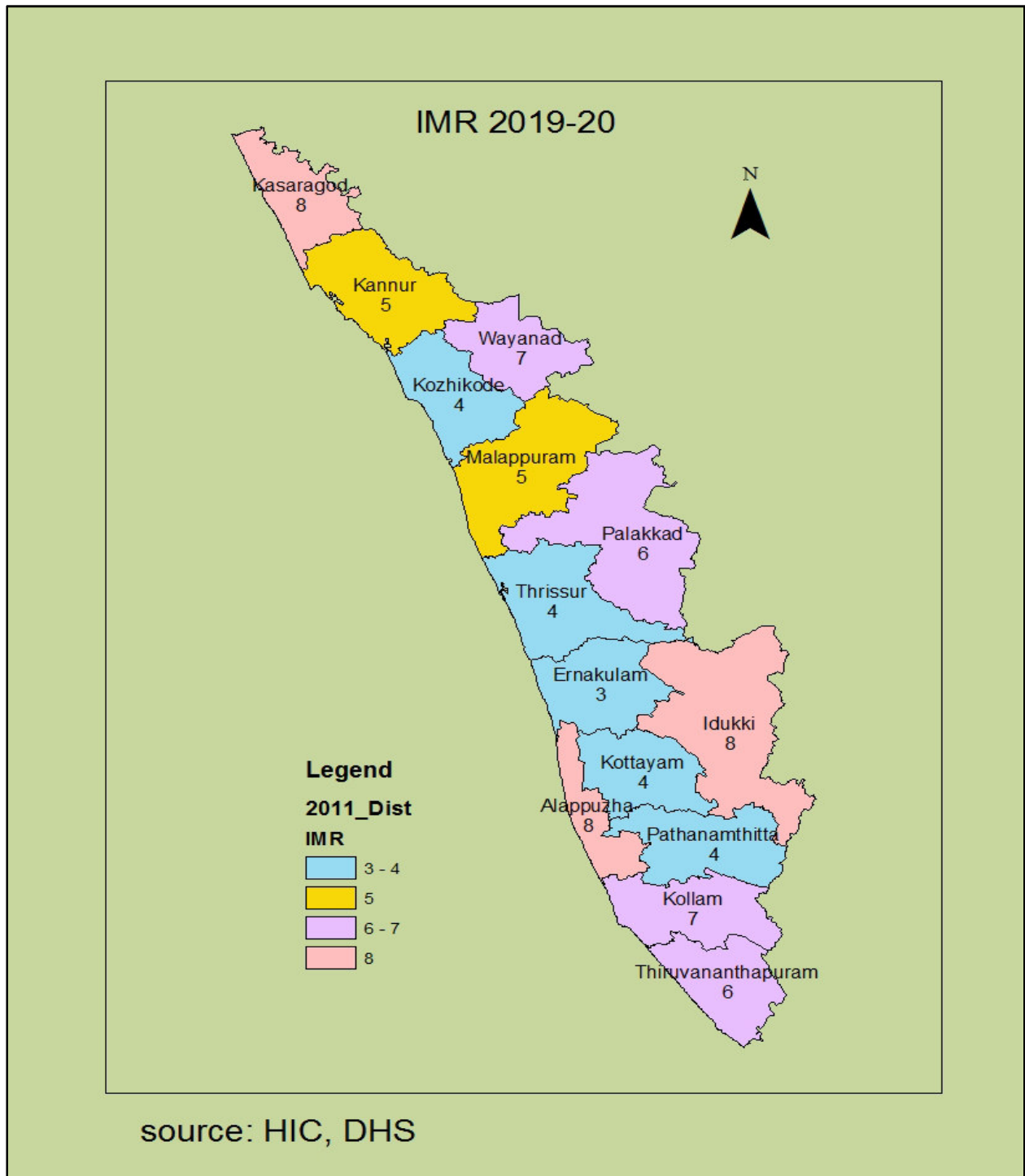

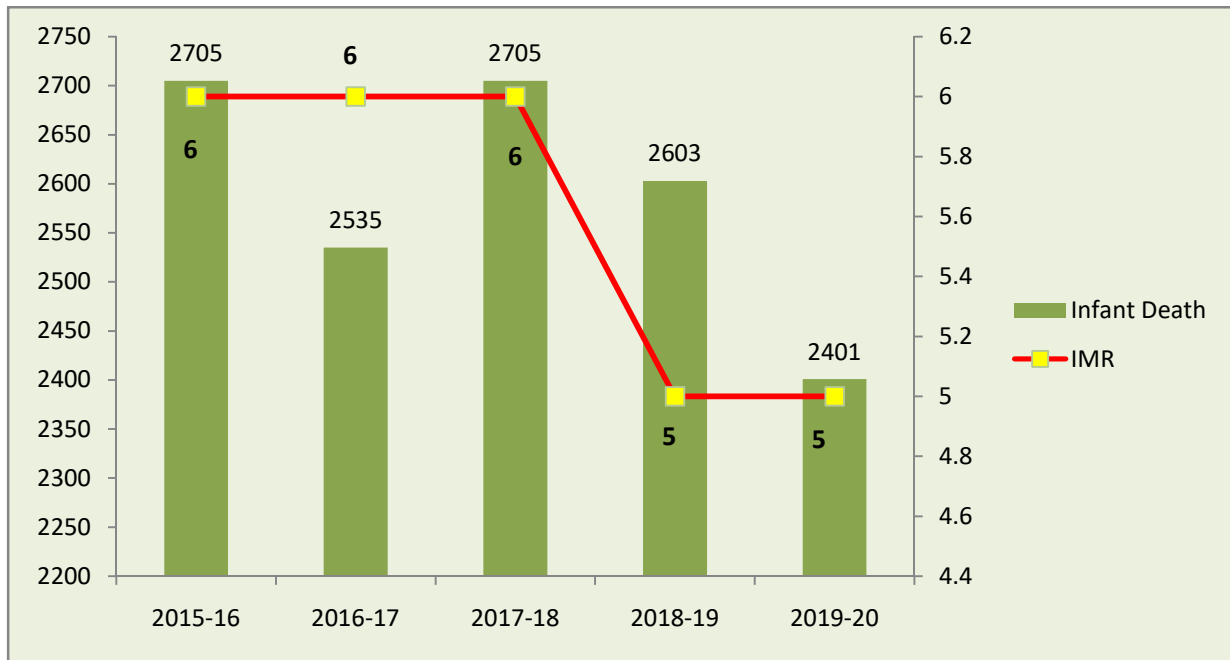

Chart 3.5.3.2 Year wise comparison of Infants deaths and IMR in Kerala



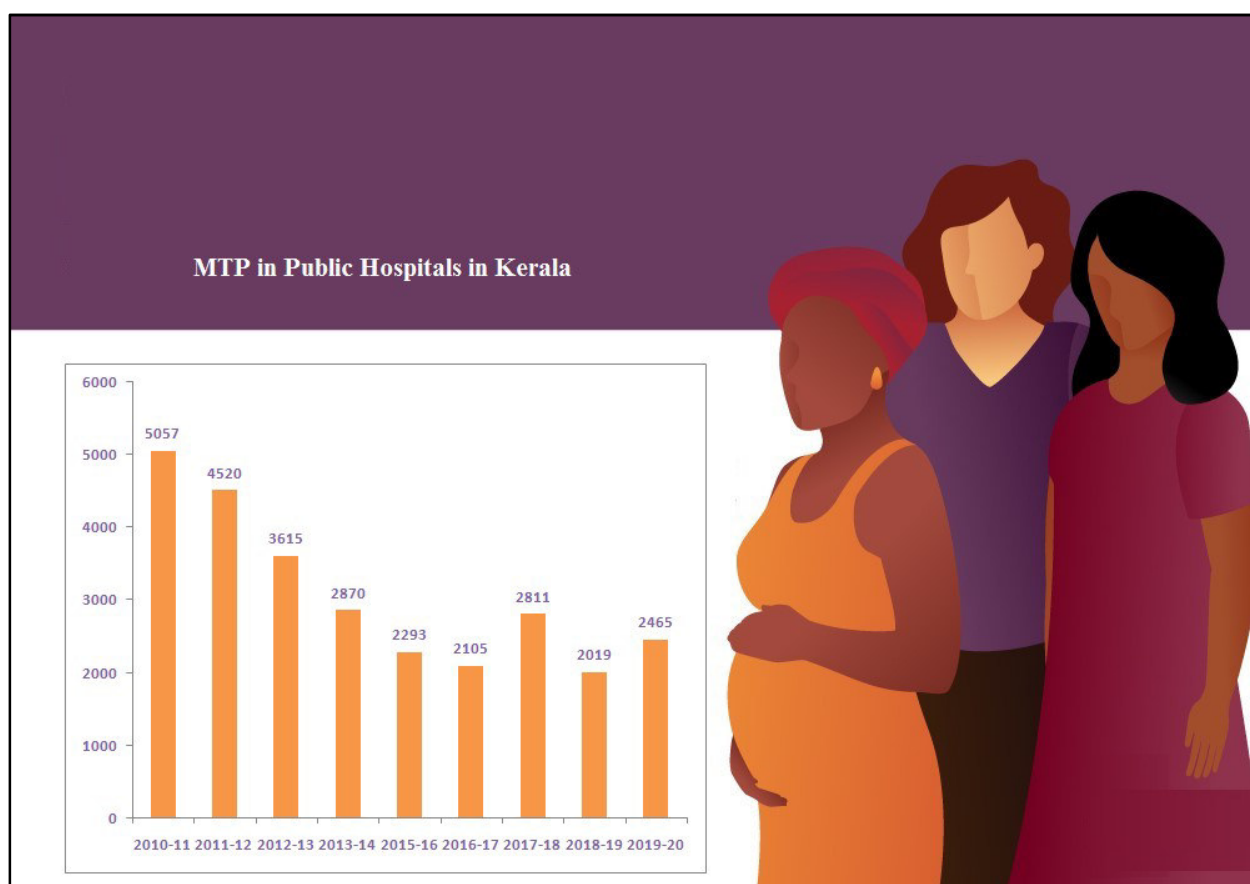
