Sub:-.Order dated 02.06.2026 of the Hon'ble Kerala Administrative Tribunal in O.A No.126/2026 filed by Smt T.O. Seema, Health Inspector Grade II -Complied with - Orders issued.

The Honourable Kerala Administrative Tribunal as per order cited as 1st above has directed the 2nd respondent to consider and pass orders on the appeal filed by Smt. T.O. Seema, HI Gr. II, FHC, Thrikkaruva, Kollam within 3 weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of the order. She has filed the O.A, challenging the general transfer order 2025 to the extent, she is transferred from Kollam district to Palakkad district.

In support of her claim for retention in Kollam district, she submitted that her 24 years old son, suffering from 50% locomotor disability, requires her presence along with her ailing mother-in-law who is 92 years old.

. The claim of the applicant is that her son, who is a 24 year old, is having 50% locomotor disability and therefore she is entitled for continuance in her parent district by virtue of clause 4 (iii) contained in G.O (P) No. 3/2017/P&ARD dated 25.02.2017. The said clause states that an employee may be given transfer in accordance with his/her choice if his/her fully dependent son/daughter requires the care and presence of the employee. Applicant has produced the medical certificate, proving that her son is suffering from 50% locomotor

disability.

Her son is studying in College of Agriculture, Vellayani, Thiruvananthapuram and the applicant was working at Kollam .This shows that the applicant's son is not fully fully dependent on her.

The vacancies stated in annexure A17 are the vacancies which are considered for General transfer 2026. Currently the General transfer process is at final stage. Smt Seema T O is not eligible for applying general transfer as she had not completed 3 year service outside home station.

It is submitted that applications for transfer to Alappuzha were received from candidates who possessed over three years of service in other districts, as well as from those with longer outstation service than the petitioner.

Under these circumstances, the appeal of the applicant is rejected and it is also stated that the department may consider her for appointment on sympathetic grounds in vacancies mentioned in annexure A17 after the finalisation of General Transfer process following transfer guidelines.

5. The Order of the Hon'ble Kerala Administrative Tribunal read as 1st above, is thus complied with.
